This course covers fire protection law as referenced in NFPA standard. Topics include legal terms, contracts, liability, review of case histories, and other related topics. Upon completion, students should be able to discuss laws, codes, and ordinances as they relate to fire protection.

Upon completing requirements for this course, the student will be able to:

1. Locate and discuss the NC General Statutes chapter (NCGS 14-58) governing arson laws.
2. Locate and discuss current proposed legislation on arson laws in North Carolina.
3. Discuss the legal definitions of arson as it applies to various types of structures (NCGS 14-58)
4. Discuss the legal protection afforded to firefighters and other emergency management personnel injured as a result of arson (NCGS 14-69.3).
5. Discuss IFC fire prevention codes governing fire prevention (IFC 903, 906 and 907).
6. Discuss IFC maintenance standards for fire safety equipment (IFC 503 and 507).
